- 1. Regardless of individual course grades, students must maintain a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA.
- 2. Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.
- 3. The Carolina Core provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students.
- Students in Palmetto College are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the 122 course through course credit or the
  corresponding foreign language placement score.
- 5. ECON 224 may substitute for ECON 221 and ECON 222, in which case another approved elective will be needed to meet hours to graduate.
- 6. The Arts and Sciences electives must include two disciplines. See Bulletin for a list of course options.
- 7. Sufficient elective hours as needed to meet the 120-credit-hour requirement.
- Integrative Major Courses: Select 33 credits from the following lists, with at least 9 credits from each of the three categories, and at least 12 credits at the 400 level. No more than 15 hours combined from MGMT, ACCT, and ECON may be selected. Please check the Bulletin for required prerequisites.

EStudents that wish to have an area of focus in entrepreneurship are recommended to complete at least 15 hours of the major from among a specific sub-set of course identified as related to entrepreneurship. It is recommended that students should also take PALM 494 rather than PALM 495 to gain internship experience. PALM 494 does not count toward the 15 hours of Entrepreneurship courses. This area of focus in entrepreneurship designation does not appear on the student's academic transcript, nor on the diploma. Major courses that are acceptable for credit toward this area of focus are identified in the academic bulletin by appearing with the designation (E) after the name of the course.
