UNDECLARED AT U OF SC: *PROSPECTIVE AND INCOMING FRESHMEN*

- Prospective students may apply to UofSC as “Undeclared” students
- Undeclared During the First Year:
 - College: *Arts and Sciences*, Major: *Undeclared*
 - First year students may be *Undeclared in CAS* for up to 30 credit hours
 - At or before 30 credit hours students will declare a suitable major
- CAS Undeclared Academic Advisors provide specialized advising to Undeclared First year students





UNDECLARED AT U OF SC: *CURRENT STUDENTS*

- Current students may be Undeclared in the Undergraduate Studies program for up to 2 semesters
 - College: *Undergraduate Studies*, Major: *Undeclared*
 - Exploratory Advisors in the UAC
 - Act as primary academic advisors for UGS students
 - Provide holistic, individually tailored advising in one-hour appointments
- How does a current student become Undeclared in Undergraduate Studies?
 - By dismissal:
 - Dismissed by their College or School for missing academic progression requirements
 - By request:
 - Students who want to change into a major in a different college or school but are not yet eligible to do so
 - Students who are in a genuine state of undecidedness and need holistic advising guidance

What does it mean to be "Undeclared" at UofSC?

Being an "undeclared" student at UofSC means that you are not yet enrolled in a specific degree-granting major. There are several reasons a student may be undeclared, the most common of which include:

- Being undecided about academic path, career path, or both
- Wanting to learn more about what majors are offered at UofSC
- Trying to decide between a few majors of interest
- Waiting until it is possible to move into a major of choice
